EXPOSURE TO RISK FACTORS



- 1- SUBSTANDARD LIVING CONDITIONS DUE TO POVERTY-LEVEL INCOME
- 2- DOMESTIC, EMOTIONAL, AND SEXUAL ABUSE
- 3- NEGLECT, CONFLICT WITHIN THE FAMILY AND ERRATIC PARENTING BECAUSE OF DEATH OR DIVORCE
- 4- DRUG AND ALCOHOL ABUSE BY CAREGIVERS
- 5- ABSENCE OF A PARENT INCARCERATED FOR COMMITTING A CRIME
- 6- VIOLENCE IN MOVIES AND TV
- 7- LOW INTEREST IN ATTENDING SCHOOL

LEADS TO ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOR, MARKED BY ALIENATION, SEVERE AGGRESSION, AND LOW ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

- 9- DEFIANCE OF AUTHORITY
- 10- HOSTILITY AND ANTAGONISM TOWARD PEERS
- 11- UNPREPARED FOR SCHOOL
- 12- LACK OF LOGIC AND INABILITY TO THINK THROUGH PROBLEMS

- 13- EARLY USE OF TOBACCO, ALCOHOL AND DRUGS
- 14- TRUANCY
- 15- HIGH NUMBER OF DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS
- 16- REJECTION BY TEACHERS AND PEERS
- 17- BOUNCES FROM SCHOOL TO SCHOOL WITH IRREGULAR ATTENDANCE
- 18- LITTLE OR NO ACADEMIC PROGRESS
- 19- IN TROUBLE WITH THE LAW AT AN EARLY AGE
